Prof. Dr. Chin Nyeon Lee obtained a Diploma in Animal Health and Production at the Universiti Pertanian Malaysia (currently known as Universiti Putra Malaysia) in 1976. He was then conferred with a bachelor degree in Animal Science from Iowa State University, Ames, USA in 1979 and completed his Master of Science and PhD at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, USA in 1981 and 1984, both in Dairy Science. After completing his study, he joined the Department of Animal Science, University of Hawaii, Manoa in 1986. Prof. Lee's research interests include postpartum cow reproduction, dairy production and management. He has been emphasizing the stress physiology in food animals under the tropical and subtropical environment and also developing the method on alleviating and quantifying heat stress in dairy and beef cattle. His work can be found in a wide range of journals such as Andrology, Environmental Entomology, Zygote, etc. He had also contributed 2 chapters in text books for professionals. He spent 2 years as Director of Marketing (Asia) for an international marketing company in 1993-1994 and he was also the first Executive Director of the Agribusiness Development Corporation, State of Hawaii. His on-going extension project integrates livestock production in ecosystem that involves land use, waste management and alternative crops.
